Next weekend, we will have a very important 2<sup>nd</sup> collection that has been recently created by Bishop Trautman, "The Good Shepherd Collection" on behalf of our retired, or "senior" priests. The purpose of this collection is to (1) raise funds to help cover the cost of assisted living and long-term health care expenses for those priests whose personal financial resources are inadequate; (2) To provide Bishop Trautman with a source of funds which he may utilize when there are unexpected needs for priests who are elderly, ill, or incapacitated; (3) to assist in reducing the deficit associated with the continued operation of the Bishop Michael J. Murphy Residence for Priests. There seems to be some confusion about this collection. Many people think that the collection for "Retired Religious" takes care of these needs. *That collection does not!* The collection for Retired Religious, which is done in December, is for all of the elderly male and female religious that have faithfully served the Church for decades. That collection is not for diocesan priests! This collection helps in the costs of caring for all of the elderly and retired priests of the Diocese of Erie; the number, of which, is steadily growing. As of today, we have a little over 50 retired priests in our Diocese. May I be bold enough that, on behalf of them, you can be as generous as you are able in helping with their needs. These faithful men have truly given so much for the people of this Diocese. And, may we continue to pray for more vocations to the priesthood and religious life, as well as for a healthy and happy retirement for our elder priests and religious.

Fr. Amico, the Pastor of St. Paul's, wants me to invite all of you to their Spaghetti Dinner this Sunday, the 26<sup>th</sup>. They are having it in their auditorium at 16<sup>th</sup> & Walnut. I WILL be going, since he comes to ours', and loudly complains that I haven't been to his!! Those Italian Pastors get very high strung! So, make sure you go!

Next Sunday, May 3<sup>rd</sup>, is First Communion for our children here at Sacred Heart. We will be celebrating it at the 11:30 Mass. Please know that everyone is invited, since these wonderful children are part of our family. May we be sure to pray for them this week, as they make their final preparations for such a powerful experience: receiving the very presence of the Risen Christ in the Eucharist! May we pray that their parents and families truly foster in them a deep devotion to the Eucharist, by celebrating with us each Sunday, and not just at Christmas and Easter. Let us all pray that our young people will always keep the Word of God and the presence of Jesus in His Body & Blood so close to their hearts.

Next Saturday, May 2<sup>nd</sup>, is the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of St. Elizabeth Church in Linden, New Jersey. My classmate, Fr. Every once in a while we enjoy some lively entertainment or a fascinating speaker. The meeting comes to a close with a light snack, friendly chitchat and laughter.

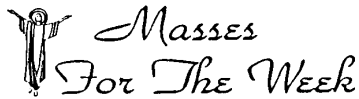

They use their pension for basic needs, such as food, housing and transportation. The skyrocketing costs for medical services, prescription drugs, long-term care and gaps in Medicare coverage have resulted in some of these priests over the years exhausting their savings for expenses of health care and absolute essentials. Thus, there is a pressing need to support those priests with supplementary assistance with their expenses for non-insured medical costs and long-term care costs. As the number of retired priest's increases, the Priest Retirement Plan needs to grow to meet their needs.
